Description of	Job description	
Fellowship	The Fellow will be involved in adult elective foot and ankle procedures with the combination of supervised operating and operating independently. Fellows will receive extensive exposure to ankle, hindfoot, midfoot and forefoot corrections including Total Ankle arthroplasty with Infinity / Prophecy. There will be a mixture of exposure to public hospital surgery, as well as assisting in private hospitals. The main focus of the	

fellowship is hands-on experience to allow the Fellow to develop the skills to operate independently as the primary surgeon. The Fellow will also be working with the other foot and ankle surgeons within the department.

The hospital is a level 2 trauma centre and has a busy workload with 3 trauma theatres running per day. Focus of the fellowship is on lower limb trauma with complex cases done in conjunction with subspecialty surgeons. Roster of 2 full day acute operating lists per week. The Fellow will also be part of the senior registrar call roster to cover weekends and evenings.

There will be opportunities for the Fellow to be involved in weekly department teaching, journal clubs and registrar teaching sessions.

One major research presentation and publication is expected.
